



Camper Code of Conduct Guidelines

The University of California, Irvine Campus Recreation Summer Day Camp staff is looking forward to providing your child with a fun, memorable, and safe summer camp experience. Each camper has a responsibility to act in a way that assures a positive experience for all. All campers are required to follow these guidelines.

Behavior Guidelines

- Campers shall be **responsible** for their words and actions.
 - Campers shall be **respectful** of others.
 - Campers shall **listen** and follow directions from camp staff.

Prohibited Behaviors

- Endangering the mental health and safety of self and, other campers.
- Continual disruption of the program.
- Refusal to follow behavioral guidelines created by camp staff.
- Inappropriate verbal or physical contact.
- Using profanity or inappropriate language or displaying clothing or other personal items with offensive content.
- Cyber Bullying or acts of aggression or violence. Use of electronic information and communication devices to willfully and repeatedly harm either a person or persons through the medium of electronic text, photos, or videos. Examples of this behavior include but are not limited to:
 - Sending false, cruel, vicious messages
 - Creating websites, posts, profiles that have stories, cartoons, pictures, and jokes ridiculing others within camp.
 - Breaking into an email account and sending vicious or embarrassing materials to others.
 - Engaging someone in electronic communication, tricking that person into revealing sensitive personal information and forwarding that information to others.
 - Screenshot, recording or pictures of camp class are not allowed.
- Possession of weapons - any object that may cause harm to another, or place another person in fear of his/her safety, may be considered a weapon.

Steps taken for failure to follow these behavior guidelines

- Counselor will redirect the camper to a more appropriate behavior.
- The camper will be reminded of the behavior guidelines.
- If the behavior persists, Camp Director or Coordinator will schedule Camp Check-In to discuss the problem with a parent/guardian.
- The staff will document the situation. The written documents will include what the behavior problem is, what provoked the situation, and the corrective action taken.
- If the problem persists to the point where a second meeting becomes necessary, the Camp Director may find it necessary to reduce the number of session the child attends.
- If a camper's behavior at any time threatens the immediate safety of him/her, other campers, or staff, the parent/guardian will be notified and child will be removed from camp day or even weekly session.

Failure to comply with the Code of Conduct may result in the removal from the program and/or additional fees. There will be no refunds given for campers who are removed from the program due to violations of the Code of Conduct.
